Property with a taxable assessment of \$100,000 would see approximately <u>\$57.64</u> increase in their tax bill; <u>\$4.80 per month</u>



School Bus Purchase

Two (2) 66-passenger school buses

The district is eligible for roughly 80% reimbursement through Transportation Aid – <u>net cost</u> <u>is \$62,400</u>

\$312,000 will be paid from the district's Reserve Fund and has <u>no impact</u> on the 2023-24 school tax levy



What Happens If the Budget is Defeated? The Board of Education may offer a revised budget for revote or immediately adopt a contingency budget One revote is allowed on the third Tuesday in June (June 20, 2023) If the revote fails, the Board of Education must adopt a contingency budget by July 1 **Contingency Budget** The tax levy is capped at the tax levy of the 2022-23 year or \$8,295,381 Non-contingent expenses removed Administrative component cap



Voter Information

The vote will take place on Tuesday, May 16 from 12 noon to 8 p.m. in the Jr./Sr. High School Gym Lobby

Voter Eligibility: To be eligible to vote, residents must live in the school district for at least 30 days prior to the May 16 election, be at least 18 years of age and a citizen of the United States

Voter Registration: To vote you must be registered for either the school elections or general elections

Residents who are not registered may register to vote at the District Office 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays before May 16

Residents may also register to vote prior to voting on May 16 with photo verification and proof of residence (for example, a current utility bill)



Absentee Ballots

Residents who will not be in the area on May 16, or are otherwise unable to vote in person may apply for an absentee ballot at the District Office

The absentee ballot must be picked up by the voter in person prior to 4 p.m. on May 15

Absentee ballots must be returned to the District Clerk no later than 5 p.m. on May 16
